## Life Stages of an Oak Tree

acorn - seedling - sapling - adult tree

The tree becomes a sapling when it reaches a height of six feet (1.8 meters) and its trunk becomes one to two inches (2.5 to 5 centimeters) thick.

## Acorn Germination

- 1. acorn husk decays
- 2. roots rupture the hull
- 3. roots grow downward
- 4. roots anchor themselves in the soil
- 5. a shoot grows out of the hull
- 6. cotyledons provide food
- 7. true leaves emerge and seedling feeds itself through photosynthesis

# Factors Affecting Growth

- 1. adequate sunlight
- 2. competition from grasses and weeds
- 3. diseases
- 4. insects

- 5. grazing animals
- 6. weather conditions

#### Acorn Planting

- 1. put acorns in a bucket of water
  - a. if float toss
  - b. if sink keep
- 2. plant acorns in well aerated soil with good drainage
- 3. set acorn on its side just below the surface
- 4. keep soil moist but give plants adequate sun
